## **DRAFT Schedule of Events**

K-20 PL Opportunities for the Ontario Educators Learning Community (OELC)

#### An Overview of the Opportunity

Students with unique needs and heralding from diverse cultural and racial backgrounds rely on K-20 educators to prepare and inspire them to thrive in a rapidly changing world. The power and absolute necessity of this relationship has been reinforced through the continued accommodations made in response to COVID-19.

In order to best prepare all learners for a rapidly evolving society, workforce and democracy, the Ontario Education Collaborative Marketplace (OECM) will host a portfolio of free, high-quality professional learning (PL) opportunities for our Province's K-12 and post-secondary educators. Facilitated in partnership with Dell Technologies and Advanced Learning Partnerships (ALP), these virtual sessions will be hosted at convenient times and engage participants in interactive, application-based experiences beginning this August and extending to January 2022. A critical step in personalizing these PL sessions is to engage Ontario educators in identifying relevant themes, facilitation modes and norms.

Throughout June, we have invited diverse groups of K-12 and post-secondary educators to participate in preliminary design thinking sessions organized around specific queries. The next phase in our co-authorship is to invite Ontario educators to share their voices in either or both of the following channels:

- **Share reflections on critical queries.** We've created K-12 and post-secondary <u>Jamboards</u> that offer several queries for openended, diverse responses. You are invited to express your priorities and suggestions throughout the document.
- **Provide feedback on the draft schedule of events.** This document offers an initial vision for how highly-qualified facilitators might engage with Ontario educators through this community. You are invited to share feedback on all aspects of this document through this form.

All feedback captured between June 21-28 will be synthesized into an updated Schedule of Events by or before July 22. Enrollment in virtual sessions will begin July 29.

We sincerely thank you for participating in this design phase. Our foremost goal is to provide purposeful, attentive and inclusive sessions that amplify the experience, skill and wisdom of Ontario educators.

#### **DESIGN PRINCIPLES**

- Align all sessions to the U.N. Sustainable Development Goals, the Ontario Global Competencies and relevant Calls to Action identified by the Truth & Reconciliation Commission.
- Embed norms that uplift a spirit of inclusion and reflection on the complex nature of learning and teaching brought about by COVID-19.
- Differentiate sessions to best serve the unique needs of elementary, secondary and postsecondary educators.
- Provide convenient, practical learning experiences that empower both synchronous and asynchronous collaboration.
- Implement protocols that enable interested educators to participate in multi-session, iterative and cohort-based 'deep dives'.

#### **FACILITATION PRINCIPLES**

- Engage Ontario-/Canada-based as well as highly qualified international facilitators with rich education backgrounds, who bring a diverse range of talent, life experience and content specializations.
- Provide early and regular opportunities for educators to share ideas and problems of practice that are important to them. Wherever possible, adapt facilitation in an effort to meet unique and dynamic needs. We believe in the expertise of educators and opportunities for them to share is highly desired and valuable.
- Organize session agendas and resources in ways that welcome participants to identify and work toward achieving personal learning goals.
- Share insights into the science of learning within the context of each session and model learnercentered pedagogies.

**Proposed Themes, Modes & Draft Schedule of Events** 





Dell Customer Communication - Confidential In partnership with Dell Technologies, the Ontario Education Collaborative Marketplace (OECM) will provide at no cost the following virtual professional learning (PL) sessions to Ontario educators between August 2021 and January 2022. These sessions will be facilitated by highly qualified facilitators engaged by Advanced Learning Partnerships, a Canada-based organization with an 11-year history of customized, attentive service to communities across North America.

At this phase in the design cycle, we endeavor to facilitate sessions in English and French.. No greater than 70% of the total sessions will be facilitated in English. Special consideration for rural Ontario and First Nations education communities will also be prioritized in both the design and facilitation of all sessions. Based on initial feedback shared by diverse K-12 and post-secondary Ontario educators, we share an overview of potential session themes, modes, and sample titles. All content will be subject to one additional round of edits based on their analysis as well as responses shared by educators invited by OECM.

Ontario educators who participate in professional learning sessions made available through OECM may exercise choice in both their preferred theme and session mode. We envision the following three (3) form factors that accomplish specialized, complementary outcomes for elementary, secondary and post-secondary educators.

Table 3. Professional Learning (PL) Modes.

Hands-On How-To Sessions	Hosted during lunch hours and late afternoons, each hands-on how-to session will provide participants with curated resources and guidance on their application. These agenda-driven sessions will be highly interactive and will position educators to apply new learning in their design and instruction. Sessions will be recorded and shared as well.  Up to 20 hands-on how-to sessions will be scheduled between August and January.
Virtual Courses	Virtual courses invite participants to engage in two 45-minute video-based sessions and reflect on two asynchronous prompts within a three-week window. Up to 50 educators may register for each virtual course. The total amount of time required for successful completion is no more than 6 hours.  Up to 8 virtual courses will be facilitated between August and January.
Mastermind Cohorts	Each mastermind cohort consists of 6-8 educators who earnestly commit to themselves and each other. As a team, they will engage in five (5) hourlong critical conversations that clearly define, unpack and realize their personal goals. Each cohort member will seek detailed, rigorous feedback on their work during protocol-driven collaborative dialogue in a virtual setting and will engage in asynchronous iteration.  Up to 5 mastermind cohorts will be activated between August and January.

Grounded in our design and facilitation principles as well as the professional learning themes and modes prioritized by Ontario educators, we share the following DRAFT schedule of events. Hands-on how-to and virtual course synchronous video sessions will be recorded, meta tagged and made available through the OECM website.
